

Modern Slavery Policy

Nexus Infrastructure Plc are committed to driving out acts of modern slavery and acknowledges its responsibility to the Modern Slavery Act 2015.

The Company will communicate this policy and highlight how to recognise risks of slavery and human trafficking, which is also included at induction and via toolbox talks.

The Company undertakes due diligence when considering taking on new suppliers, and regularly reviews its existing suppliers. The Company's due diligence process includes establishing long-standing relationships with suppliers and making clear our expectations of business partners and evaluating the modern slavery and human trafficking risks of each new supplier.

The Company will not support or deal with any business knowingly involved in slavery or human trafficking.

The senior management team shall take the responsibility for implementing this policy statement and its objectives and shall provide adequate resources and investment to ensure that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place within the organisations or within its supply chains.
